

G4S is proud to support The Scottish Event Campus (SEC) in its mission to be the 'best event campus in Europe': Best Venue, Best People, and Best Welcome is their mantra! The SEC features five interconnected exhibition and meeting spaces with a meeting academy consisting of adaptable spaces, a 600-seat auditorium, the iconic 3,000-seat SEC Armadillo, and the OVO Hydro – a 14,500-capacity concert, sporting, and special events arena.



The multipurpose event spaces host a range of high-profile events including COP26, MTV European Music Awards, Ignition, and the Glasgow 2014 Commonwealth Games.

The G4S team works closely with the SEC to deliver safe and enjoyable events by providing a flexible, reliable, and experienced team of Event Stewards, Security and Safety Officers, and Canine teams. The team also provides a dedicated G4S Safety Officer and Operations Manager for each event to support the venues event management team. This puts safety and security at the heart of every event by ensuring a joined up approach from planning through to event completion.

The Challenge

The SEC's iconic and multi-use space requires flexible, scalable, and experienced Safety and Security to accommodate the varied events calendar and risk profiles. For example, the staffing level may be 6 security officers for an exhibition or up to 440 security officers when all areas of the campus have events at the same time.

The post-pandemic environment has seen an increase in violence and aggression toward frontline workers, often fuelled by alcohol or narcotics. The G4S team has been required to adapt and change working practices to ensure staff and visitors feel safe and supported.

The tragic events of the Manchester Arena bombing and subsequent inquiries continue to keep the threat of terrorism a sad but important reality.





The Solution

Digital Reporting - efficient, consolidated, and environmentally friendly

To provide detailed visibility and support improved decision-making, post-event paper reporting is being replaced with digital reporting, with incidents captured by officers on a Smart device.

This means that the officer or steward can report an incident quicker and in a more consistent and comprehensive way - most importantly it shapes better security for future events. This new approach will improve officer engagement - and provide incident trend analysis to shape the direction of security moving forward, rejuvenating an important connection between frontline staff and management.

This approach will also significantly reduce the carbon footprint by ultimately eliminating paper consumption.

Canine - peace of mind with an extra layer of security

Canine security was introduced to add an extra layer of security to protect the security team and visitors from the risk of explosives, pyrotechnics, and individuals under the influence of narcotics. The explosive detection canines patrol the public areas prior to an event and provide a strong visual deterrent for any hostile reconnaissance leading up to the event. Once everything is set up, the canine team provides an intricate explosive detection search of the venue before the event commences.

During an event, explosive canines may approach any unattended bags and, within 60 seconds, determine if the bag poses any risk. This avoids a security officer needing to approach the bag, or unnecessarily evacuating the venue and the resulting financial implications. Narcotics and pyrotechnic canines patrol areas inside and around the complex to provide visitor reassurance.


Mitigating violence and aggression toward front-line workers

In partnership with the client, there is a zero-tolerance approach to any aggression towards staff at the venue

If a security officer identifies any suspicious behaviours or feels threatened they call the Event Control Room, which can deploy additional support from the onsite Response Teams. This team will be there in minutes, equipped with body-worn cameras to help de-escalate any potential aggression and provide protection to stewards.

Staff Training

Working closely with the customer, the training programme has been designed to upskill and prepare the safety and security teams to meet the requirements of the venue such as Fire Safety training, and Disability Awareness training. Training is carried out during their induction as well as ongoing online training modules.
